



#### BY THE NUMBERS:

- 710 Line Apprentices (92 are Local 160 hands) \*49 Apprentices out of work (4 are Local 160 hands)
- 57 Substation Apprentices (4 are Local 160 hands)
- 13 Operator Apprentices (1 is a Local 160 hand)
- 17 Traffic Signal Apprentices
- 14 URD Technicians
- 6 Cable Splicing Technicians

For a grand total of 866 Apprentices and Trainees.

#### **NEWS:**

Starting on January 1st, 2024, all line apprentices monthly time cards and evaluations will be submitted electronically. Apprentices have already completed self-guided training through the RLS app or on a web browser. In order to send the time card and evaluation to the foreman, they will need a good phone number and email address. It is up to you if you choose to provide your work or personal contact information.

The basic steps of the process are as follows:

- 1. Apprentices log their daily hours and activities in the RLS app. All days are to be accounted for.
- 2. At the end of the month, if an apprentice changes crews, or if they are laid off, they submit their time to the foreman.
- 3. The foreman will receive a text message and email notification a time card has been submitted. You can review or reject the time, but cannot change it for them.
- 4. If the time card is correct, you can fill out the monthly evaluation and approve the time card for them.
- 5. Once approved, it is returned to the apprentice electronically and their responsibility to submit the completed document to the apprenticeship office.

When the document is sent back and forth, the apprentice will receive a text, email and a notification through the app. When they complete the final submittal to the office, they will also receive conformations in the app and through email.

After you have been notified about the time card being submitted to you (foreman), you will receive a link to take you through the sign in process. If for some reason you have difficulty logging in or accessing anything, please contact support using the "chat with us" section in the app. Currently, the RLS app is only for Apple. Android users can access through a web browser.

Each monthly report card and field evaluation are due on the 1st day of the following month. Apprentices will have a grace period until 11:59PM CST on the 10th day of the following month. This means that apprentices must submit the information to their foreman with enough time for it to be reviewed, completed, and the foreman to send it back to the apprentice to complete the final step of submittal before he grace period expires. You may get notifications at odd times based on when the apprentices fill out and submit the time cards to you for review and approval. If these notifications come outside of working hours, do not feel the need to respond to it immediately. Foremen are not expected to fill out the time cards or evals after hours or on weekends.

# **Suicide Prevention** 5 Things You Should Know

Suicide is a leading cause of death among workingage adults in the United States. It deeply impacts workers, families, and communities. Fortunately, like other workplace fatalities, suicides can be prevented. Below are 5 things to know about preventing suicide.

BE AWARE

### Everyone can help prevent suicide.

Mental health and suicide can be difficult to talk about–especially with work colleagues–but your actions can make a difference. When you work closely with others, you may sense when something is wrong.

PAY ATTENTION

### Know the warning signs of suicide.

There is no single cause for suicide but there are warning signs. Changes in behavior, mood, or even what they say may signal someone is at risk. Take these signs seriously. It could save a life.



REACH OUT

#### Ask "Are you okay?"

If you are concerned about a coworker, talk with them privately, and listen without judgment. Encourage them to reach out to your Employee Assistance Program (EAP), the human resources (HR) department, or a mental health professional.



TAKE ACTION

# If someone is in crisis, stay with them and get help.

If you believe a coworker is at immediate risk of suicide, stay with them until you can get further help. Contact emergency services or the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline.
