From September 11th through the 15th, I had the privilege of attending the National Safety Council meeting and the IBEW Safety Caucus in San Diego, California, with fellow Business Representatives Daryl Tindle and Charlie Sable.

Throughout the four day event we heard many stories related to safety and some brothers shared their personal experiences that they have encountered due to a lack of following safe practices. We as a union share a common goal of working safe and watching out for each other on the job site, and it was nice to see that same goal spread out among all of the IBEW Locals across the country.

One speaker that I found to be very interesting was Dr. Don Teater, a Medical Advisor for the NSC. He spoke about the increasing effects of perscription drug overdose. A subject that affects a large percent of people in some way, shape or form. Whether it is a family member, friend or co-worker it seems like most of us know someone that is effected by this growing trend. One statistic he had was that if a person takes one Tylenol and one Ibuprofin, they would have better results for fighting pain than if they took prescription Oxycodone or other addictive pain medications. Dr. Teater was just one of many great speakers that were there.

I would like to say in closing to our Brothers and Sisters in Local Union 160, keep up the good work and continue the safe practices that our employer's ask of us, and to take care of each other so at the end of the day we all go home the same way we came to work.
